

# GENERAL ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

It is the school's policy that a child, in order to enroll in the school's K-4 and K-5 Kindergarten program, must have reached his 4th or 5th birthday on or before September 1st. Students who do not meet this requirement will be taken on a case-by-case basis. In addition to that, every student must have complete health and academic records on file with the school.

Calvary Academy is distinctly a Christian school primarily designed to help the average or above average child. We are neither a remedial school nor a reform school. We reserve the right to place each child in the academic level for which he is best suited.

## EDUCATION (CURRICULUM, POLICY, AND OBJECTIVES)

Calvary Academy provides for a full day kindergarten program and a curriculum for grades one to twelve which includes all major subject areas, as well as instruction in general music, art, library, and physical education. The [A Beka](#) Book curriculum and textbook program is used uniformly throughout the school and is supplemented with other Christian texts and materials. Bible is taught everyday to all students as a major subject with one day each week set aside for a chapel service to include guest speakers and student participation. It is recognized that the A Beka Book program provides for a more advanced curriculum and a higher level of expectation for the student than would otherwise be encountered in the public sector or perhaps other Christian schools.

Because God is the source of all knowledge, all academic material is taught with the Bible as the final authority for truth. Each student is required to have his Bible, the King James Version, in school daily. The King James Version is required so that all memorization will be uniform. Each school day begins with pledges (American Flag, Christian Flag, Bible) and prayer. Students are expected to participate.

Calvary Academy is a private institution. Calvary Academy reserves the privilege of setting and maintaining its own standards of student conduct, dress, cleanliness, and scholarship. The school administration maintains the right to refuse admittance to anyone it so chooses, and to suspend or expel anyone who violates the standards set down in the Standard of Conduct as defined by the school.

Attendance at Calvary Academy is a privilege, not a right. Christian standards of conduct are expected of all students at all times. In order to continue in the school, students must comply with the standards and regulations set forth and exhibit an attitude that is in harmony with the spirit and purpose of the school
