

Prescription Medication

NO PRESCRIPTION MEDICATIONS SHALL BE ADMINISTERED IN SCHOOL EXCEPT BY THE DIRECT ORDER OF A PHYSICIAN. THE PARENT OR GUARDIAN MUST COMPLETE AND SIGN THE PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION INFORMATION FORM PRIOR TO THE DISPENSING OF PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION. CALVARY ACADEMY DOES NOT SUPPLY ANY PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION. IT IS THE PARENT'S RESPONSIBILITY TO SUPPLY ALL MEDICATIONS TO BE TAKEN AT SCHOOL.

NONPRESCRIPTION MEDICATION

NONPRESCRIPTION MEDICATIONS SHALL BE ADMINISTERED IN SCHOOL EXCEPT BY THE DIRECT ORDER OF A PHYSICIAN, PARENT, OR GUARDIAN. THE PARENT OR GUARDIAN MUST COMPLETE AND SIGN THE NONPRESCRIPTION MEDICATION INFORMATION FORM PRIOR TO THE DISPENSING OF THE NONPRESCRIPTION MEDICATION. CALVARY ACADEMY DOES NOT SUPPLY ANY NONPRESCRIPTION MEDICATION. IT IS THE PARENT'S RESPONSIBILITY TO SUPPLY ALL MEDICATIONS TO BE TAKEN AT SCHOOL. THE ONLY EXCEPTION TO THIS RULE IS FOR ASPIRIN OR TYLENOL IF THE PARENT GIVES PERMISSION.

It shall be the policy of Calvary Academy that the school secretary will be responsible for administering medication to students.

Calvary Academy will cooperate with parents and their medical practitioners in giving prescribed medications when these must be given during school hours. To comply with a request, the parent or guardian must complete the Medication Information form for either Prescription or Nonprescription Medication. The container for the medication, which is taken to school, shall carry the following information:

1. Name of the student.
2. Name of the physician.
3. Name of the medication.
4. Dosage amount.
5. Time to be given.

When possible, the parent or guardian should bring the completed medication form and the medication to school and give it to the appropriate school personnel. The parents or guardian of the child must assume responsibility for informing the school of any change in the child's health or change in medication. A new Medication Information form completed by the parent or guardian will be required with each change in medication or at the beginning of each school year.
