

CLASSROOM BEHAVIOR

Students are to be in their seats with absolutely no talking or any other form of communication by the time the 2nd bell rings.

Students are not permitted to leave the classroom for any reason without a teacher's permission before the bell to end the class has rung.

SCHOOL STORE

Limited school supplies may be purchased at the office (before and after school, and break times).

LOST and FOUND

Lost and found articles are kept in the office. A student must pay 25 cents to get the article from lost and found. Unclaimed articles are given to the Salvation Army. Lost and found is open before school; break times, and after school.

Students need to recognize that a person's property is that person's solely. Therefore, no student takes another person's property unless the owner has granted permission. It is extremely important that personal property (clothing, toys, etc.) be properly labeled to aid in identification. The lost and found is maintained for articles that have been lost. Students are expected to maintain control over their belongings and to accept full responsibility for their care and well-being.

SOCIALS IN THE CLASSROOM

Birthday treats may be allowed for the class if parents desire, but they are to be delivered to the office - not the classroom.

Christmas parties will be held the last day before vacation. Students may give their teacher a gift. Gifts may also be brought for each person in the classroom or not at all.

All class parties must be approved by the administration first.

The last day of school is a school picnic planned for all students. The administration will plan this. All students must attend.

SCHOOL PHONE

Students must get permission from the office to use the counter phone. Use of the phone may be given during the lunch hour or breaks only. (If a student is sick the office secretary will call home.) If the student will not give a reason as to why he/she needs to use the phone they will not be permitted to do so. Forgetting homework, lunch, or gym things are not acceptable reasons. There will be a 50-cent fee for all long distance calls.

MISCELLANEOUS SCHOOL RULES

Each student is expected to display a standard of behavior that shows forth Christ. He will be expected to uphold the name of the Lord, uphold the testimony of the church and his fellow classmates both in and out of school.

The school expects the full cooperation from both the student and parent in the education of the student and support of the school. If, in the view of the administration, this cooperation is lacking, the student may be requested to withdraw from the school. If the student's overall attitude or behavior indicates an uncooperative spirit or one that is out of harmony with the spirit and standards of the school, whether or not there is any definite violation of a particular school rule, he may be requested to withdraw from the school or be dismissed, expelled.

Below is a list of standards of conduct, rules, and guidelines that need to be observed:

1. Students are to be polite and to conduct themselves properly and to avoid running, pushing, and excessive loud talking.
2. Students are not to chew gum during school. Eating candy, mints, or other food is limited to lunch and recess or break time. Cough drops may be used when necessary at the teacher's discretion. All food is to be kept in the lunch area or the cement area in the gym.
3. All food must be eaten or properly disposed of in the garbage cans after lunch. No student is to throw food.
4. It is expected that all students will go outside during recess if weather permits. Students may only go outside with a recess monitor. No students are to be outside unsupervised. All students must be properly dressed for the weather conditions. Students, who cannot go outside for medical reasons, may stay indoors provided a note from the parent is on file requesting such an arrangement.
5. Behavior outside would follow the same general rules of conduct as for indoors.
6. Students are not to throw sticks, stones, snowballs, sand, etc. while out-of-doors.
7. Students must be careful with balls and other gym or playground equipment so as to be considerate of the properties of other students.
8. Students are to stay within the boundaries of the church / school under the recess supervisor's direct care at all times.
9. Students are not to roam the church or school building. Students are to report to areas where they are directed to report. Due to the fact that the church building is used for the school, students should be careful to avoid damage to church belongings and/or report all damages to their teacher and principal.
10. Students who have deliberately damaged or vandalized church and/or school property will be expected to pay all costs for repair or replacement of damaged property and may experience additional punishment such as paddling, detention, suspension, and/or expulsion.
11. Students are not to sell items for personal profit.

12. There is never to be any physical contact between the opposite sexes. Couples who are dating each other may not sit by each other in the classrooms. This is to insure the right frame of mind during the teaching of academics.
13. Students may be required to pay for damaged textbooks. This will be at the discretion of the principal.
14. Students are to be in their seats with absolutely no talking by the 2nd bell. Students are not permitted to leave the classroom for any reason without a teacher's permission before the bell to end the class has rung.
15. Students staying after school must report to the lunchroom. They must stay there until their ride arrives to pick them up. If a student is staying after school with a parent, they must be directly with that parent or in the study hall.
16. Students that plan on staying after school for extra-curricular activities must have an adult supervising them and written permission from their parents. (This does not include the volleyball team during volleyball season, or the basketball team, cheerleaders, and pep club during basketball season.)
17. Do not take balls from younger students, you may ask for them, but you may not take them (you need to respect others and be polite).
18. During breaks, you are not allowed in other classrooms; except by invitation of the teachers.
19. Jr. & Sr. High students may not play pick up games during breaks.
20. No boys may enter the gymnasium during volleyball practice and no girls are to enter the gymnasium during basketball practice.
21. Students are to be courteous - "yes sir", "yes ma'am", "please", and "thank you" are expected.
22. The school will not be responsible for toys or other personal items brought to school. Students are to be responsible for their own items and may bring them "at their own risk".
